

Groundbreaking Ceremonies of the 38.9km 69KV Sub-Transmission Line and 5MVA Power Substation & Inauguration of Claveria Action Center

AGELCO II started its year with a blast as it conducted the groundbreaking ceremonies for the 38.9km 69kV Sub-Transmission Line from Lucban, Abulug to Sanchez Mira and installation of the 5 MVA Power Substation last February 08, 2018 at Brgy. Centro 02, Sanchez Mira, Cagayan.

The construction of the Capital Expenditure (CAPEX) Project was initiated back in April, 2013 and was

duly approved by the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) last October, 2016 with a revised design formulated under the leadership of Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, OIC-General Manager of CAGELCO II. Ms. Madamba supported the revised design with a lower cost amounting to Php 186.5M without sacrificing the quality of the proposed project wherein it includes poles that can withstand a maximum wind velocity of 250kph. Thus, this also matches the optimal project cost set by ERC. The change in design was favorably approved by the Board of Directors under the leadership of BOD Pres. Eva M. Antiporda.

The said project also gained its approval from the National Electrification Administration (NEA) thru Administrator Edgrado R. Masongsong and granted a loan to CAGELCO II to finance the CAPEX project.

Paved with challenges along the way, from planning up to its actual implementation, the Management and the Board of Directors are grateful that the project will finally be realized with a target completion date of November, 2018.

CAGELCO II is confident that this shall resolve the voltage fluctuation issue in the municipalities of Pamplona, Sanchez Mira, Claveria and Sta. Praxedes.

Hon. Asela B. Sacramed, Mayor of the Municipality of Sanchez Mira and other local dignitaries were present to grace the event and witnessed the celebration as they have contributed in

the approval of these projects through a Resolution duly forwarded to ERC.

CAGELCO II continually establishes Member-Consumer-Owners (MCO) organizations in the barangays within its franchise area in support to the program of NEA Administrator Edgardo R. Masongsong in the prioritization of empowerment programs for MCOs.

In coordination with the local government units thru the barangay captains, CAGELCO II Area Offices and Board of Directors, members of the Multi-Sectoral Electrification Advisory Council (MSEAC) together with the OIC-GM, ISD-MSD, conducted formation of MCO Organization as well as election of officers in sixty-one (61) barangays as of March 28, 2018.

Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, OIC-General Manager deems that the organization of member-consumer-owners in the grassroots level will further strengthen the partnership between the Cooperative and barangay folks and significantly increases the level of consumer participation in various activities of CAGELCO II.

The cooperative targets to organize all its remaining barangays by August 2018 and federate all municipalities by December, 2018 to form part of our franchise-wide organization.

CAGELCO II wraps up 2018 Directorial Elections

CAGELCO II successfully finished its conduct of three Directorial Elections for District I (Claveria & Sta. Praxedes), District III (Abulug & Ballesteros), and District IV (Aparri) on March 10, 17, and 24 respectively, with 36.90% member-consumer-owners' participation.

On March 10, 2018, Two Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-Seven (2,667) registered Member-Consumer-Owners (MCOs) or 33.87% from the total number of consumers in District I covering Claveria and Sta. Praxedes exercised their right of suffrage during the Directorial Elections for the said district. The directorial race was won by the lone candidate and also incumbent Director, Ms. Mary Ann R. Canosa from Taggat Sur, Claveria.

For District III, the present Director Mr. Arnel Onza, unopposed candidate from Libertad, Abulug, remained as the director for said district after garnering four thousand two

hundred forty-six (4,246) votes or 37.32% of the total voters in Abulug and Ballesteros.

Lastly, member-consumer-owners of District IV (Aparri) shall be represented by their newly-elected director, Ms. Marilyn B. Donato, who was a former Area Manager & Department Manager of CAGELCO II. Although unopposed, Ms. Donato still garnered four thousand two hundred sixtysix (4,266) votes or 39.26% out of the total MCOs of the said municipality.

Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, CAGELCO II OIC-General Manager, congratulated the winning candidates for the 2018 Directorial Elections and expressed gratitude to the incumbent directors for their support in this undertaking. She also signified appreciation to CAGELCO II Management and Staff in their extra effort to encourage more consumers to participate in the said Coop activity.





CAGELCO II as EC Representative in the House of Reps Hearing

On February 05, 2018, CAGELCO II was chosen as one of the presenters during the committee hearing scheduled by the House of Representatives regarding House Bill Nos. 942, 2297, and 634, a legislative proposal to reduce the System Loss Cap of Electric Cooperatives (ECs) from 13% to 5% which was conducted at Mitra Building, Quezon City.

From among the 121 ECs in the country, CAGELCO II was one of the ECs selected by the National Electrification Administration (NEA) to discuss before the Committee on Energy the Coop's position on the effect of reducing the system loss cap and cost of investment required to reduce the system loss (SL) through the implementation of Capital Expenditure Projects.

CAGELCO II representatives Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, OIC-General Manager, together with Engr. Elmer P. Francisco- Chief, Engineering Division and Engr. Jaylor U. Tablit-Chief, Consumer Accounts & Energy Trading Division, attended the said meeting where the Coop recommended that the present system loss cap must be maintained.

Considering the present condition of the Cooperative, Engr. Francisco, Chief of Eng'g Div. who presented in behalf of CAGELCO II, stressed that the reduction of technical system loss is possible, however, the effect will burden the member-consumerowners as power rate increases in order to implement CAPEX projects needed to lower system loss.



MSEAC reaffirms support for CAGELCO II's Member-Consumer-Owners' Empowerment Program

Within the first quarter of 2018, CAGELCO II has completed to meet its nine (9) districts of the Multi-Sectoral Electrification Advisory Council (MSEAC) to further strengthen the institutional networking of the Cooperative as new goals and targets have been agreed in order to maintain CAGELCO II's Triple A Categorization.

One of the discussions made during the meeting was the New Key Performance Standards (KPS) set forth by the National Electrification Administration (NEA) which was raised to a higher bar wherein more membership participation is required to various coop activities such as Directorial Elections and Annual General Membership Assemblies.

Moreover, the formation of Member-Consumer-Owners (MCO) Organization was also presented including its effect which gained a favorable remark from the members and signified their support in the completion of the task until June, 2018.

Since the establishment of the MSEAC, CAGELCO II has considered its members as effective complement to member-related activities which contributed to what the Cooperative has achieved for the past years.

value and output of the team leading to a more improved services for the member-consumer-owners. Further, this quarterly meet-up started in April, 2017 as one of her activities upon her assumption to office as OIC, General Manager.

Moreover, sub-offices thru the Area Managers reported their 2017 Year-End accomplishments and laid down the targets for the year. With this, OIC-GM Madamba looks forward to an excellent performance in its financial, technical, and institutional operations for the years ahead.

Twenty-six (26) CAGELCO II employees composed of Electrical Engineers and IT experts participated in the DNV GL Synergi Electric Software version 6.0.2. held last February 12-14, 2018 at CAGELCO II Multi-Purpose Hall, Aparri, Cagayan.

The three-day activity capacitated the trainees on the Basic Training Course which covers Power Distribution System Modelling, Load Flow, Reliability Analysis, and Protective Device Coordination among others.

The engineering software will be utilized in the simulation and analysis of the Coop's proposed Capital Expenditure (CAPEX) Projects and other related technical operation of the distribution system.

Engr. Prosperido S. Ignacio, Jr. CAGELCO II's Technical Services Department Manager sees that the seminar is of great importance as it will enable the participants to simulate the effects of proposed Capital Expenditure projects of the Cooperative and further develop programs to improve technical operations which will redound to lower system loss.

Resource Speaker Engr. Renato S. Sol of Triple 7 Consultants & Trading Company led the discussion of said engineering analysis software with the aim to sharpen trainees' abilities and knowledge.
