

CAGELCO II CONDUCTS DISTRICT ELECTIONS 2017



Dr. Vicente T. Manibog, a retired District Supervisor and an active MSEAC Member, recently won the District V (Camalaniugan, Lallo, & Allacapan) Directorial Election last March 11, 2017.



Engr. Wilfredo B. Dingayan, MSEAC Member, representing the Religious Sector of District VIII (Gattaran & Lasam), will be representing his district in the CAGELCO II Board.



Engr. Jacinto S. Semana was proclaimed the new director of District IX (Gonzaga & Sta. Ana) after outnumbering his opponent, Ms. Nenita Ayuyang by 1, 590 votes.

AGELCO II successfully conducted its three (3) District Elections in its coverage area particularly in Districts V, VIII, and IX last March 11, 18, and 25, respectively.

Over the last three years, District V covering Lal-lo, Camalaniugan and Allacapan have not been represented in the CAGELCO II Board due to lack of qualified candidates, however, in June 2016, the MSEAC of the same district nominated and endorsed to the Board of Directors three candidates to serve the remaining term until the conduct of regular elections. Ms. Cristeta C. Balisi was appointed by the Board of

Directors and duly confirmed by NEA. Dir. Balisi shall turnover the directorial seat to Dr. Vicente T. Manibog, a lone candidate, as the elected Director of District V from the recently concluded directorial elections on March 11, 2017.

Dr. Manibog was a member of the Multi-Sectoral Electrification Advisory Council (MSEAC) representing the Civic Sector prior to his election as Board of Director.

While in District VIII covering Gattaran and Lasam, CAGELCO II steered the Directorial Elections on March 18, 2017 with only one candidate in the person of Engr. Wilfredo B. Dingayan from Lasam, Cagayan. He was also a member

of the MSEAC in the same district representing the Religious Sector prior to his candidacy. He garnered a total of 1, 080 votes in the said District. Mr. Romeo E. Castillejos, the outgoing Director and CAGELCO II Board President shall likewise pass on the responsibility as District Director to Engr. Dingayan after finishing two

(2) consecutive terms.

Lastly, the member-consumerowners of District IX covering Gonzaga and Sta. Ana will now be properly represented thru their newly elected Director, Engr. Jacinto S. Semana

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Brgy. Paradise, Gonzaga, Cagayan. The Directorial Election was held on March 25, 2017 with a total of twenty three (23)precincts strategically located in various elementary schools in both municipalities.

Engr. Semana got the most number of

votes at two thousand seven hundred thirty (2,730) while his opponent Ms. Nenita P. Ayuyang garnered a total of one thousand one hundred forty (1,140) votes.

During the District IX election,

one of the voters took note of the importance of participating in activities such as this because it creates transparency among memberconsumer-owners as they exercise their right to vote on the candidate they favor.

Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, the Officer-in-Charge (OIC), CAGELCO II and ISD Manager thanked both parties for the peaceful and successful election in their area.

1-CARE proposes house bill 3351

On March 7, 2017, Representative Carlos Roman Uybarreta presented to the Committee on Energy House Bill No. 3351 or the Anti-Power Line Disturbance Act.

During his presentation, Representative Uybarreta explained to the committee that the main cause of toppled electric poles during typhoons are the structures or vegetation/trees that usually falls over the electric lines.

Representative Uybarreta backed this up with data coming from the various Electric Cooperatives, NGCP and NEA which shows the cost of damages

caused by said structures/vegetation. House Bill No. 3351 will prohibit the construction of structures and the planting of vegetation/trees on the right of way corridors of transmission and distribution lines. Furthermore, the bill also prohibits the conduct of hazardous activities along the said right of way corridors.

FAST FACT:

1-CARE is a consumer advocacy alliance which seeks to protect and promote consumer rights to avail quality and affordable goods and services from utilities such as electricity, water, telephone and transportation. It is represented by Atty. Carlos Roman Uybarretta.

Representative Uybarreta commended the electric cooperatives and our transmission utility for making sure that electric and transmission poles are built as per the standard set in the Philippine Electric/Grid Code but he stressed the need for this bill to be passed so we can avoid experiencing

power interruption caused by the aforementioned problem.

The Committee decided to create a technical working group which is set to meet on March 28, 2017 to harmonize the provisions of the bill with other existing laws.

NEA vows to intensify electrification of rural communities, empowerment of electric coops

THE NATIONAL ELECTRIFICATION ADMINISTRATION (NEA) HAS CRAFTED PLANS ANEW TO INTENSIFY THE RURAL ELECTRIFICATION (RE) PROGRAM AND CAPACITATE ITS PARTNER ELECTRIC COOPERATIVES (ECS) FOLLOWING NEA ADMINISTRATOR EDGARDO MASONGSONG'S VOW FOR A MORE STRENGTHENED PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE AGENCY AND THE ECS.

In the NEA 2017 Strategic Thinking Conference-Workshop held on December 26-28, 2016 at the NEA Building, Diliman, Quezon City, Administrator Masongsong batted for multi-pronged initiatives that will not only accelerate the energization of unlit areas in the country, but will also make the services of the Agency more responsive to the needs of the ECs and the electricity consumers.

"Under my leadership, I want the NEA to be more consumer-focused. We will work together with the electric cooperatives in rolling out programs that fully tap the potential of rural electrification to enhance people's productivity and make them active partners in building sustainable rural communities," A d m i n i s t r a t o r Masongsong said.

The Administrator added, "Definitely, we will have to fast-track the implementation of the Sitio Electrification Program and the Barangay Line Enhancement Program to be able to introduce e m p o w e r m e n t programs for our

member-owner-consumers. Without electricity in the remote areas, it will be difficult for us to push programs that can complement the productivity skills of our rural folks."

ELECTRIFICATION PROGRAMS

The Sitio Electrification Program (SEP) and the Barangay Line Enhancement Program (BLEP) are interrelated electrification projects of the NEA which started in 2010.

For 2017, the Agency has committed 2,140 sitios for energization with a total evaluated project cost of Php1.8 billion. This covers 825 programmed sitios in Luzon, 878 in Visayas, and 707 in Mindanao.

Meanwhile, NEA is also targeting to complete a total of 104 BLEP projects nationwide, of which seven are submarine cable installations and six are tapping point upgrading. 48 of the total BLEP projects are programmed for Mindanao, while 42 and 14 are expected

to be accomplished in Visayas and Luzon, respectively.

Funding for these projects is sourced from 2013, 2014, and 2015 BLEP subsidies and the 2013 PAMANA development fund.

NEW VISION STATEMENT

During the Strategic Thinking Conference-Workshop, the assembly has likewise moved to formulate a new vision statement that will significantly align the direction of the Agency to the salient provisions of EPIRA.

The new vision statement of the NEA reads: "A dynamic and responsive NEA that is a vanguard of sustainable rural development in partnership with globally-competitive Electric Cooperatives and empowered Electricity Consumers."

Administrator Masongsong said "the vision will serve as NEA's pledge to perform better in exercising its mandate of totally electrifying the countryside and in putting to fore the interest of the member-owner-consumers, which remains a primary concern for President Rodrigo R. Duterte and Secretary Alfonso G. Cusi. Their espousal of a pro-people government is a clear proof that change, indeed, has come."

The Administrator added, "I hope that during my tenure as your NEA Administrator, and with the help of the general constituency of the institution, the aggregate of the employees and officers of the ECs, the support of industry stakeholders, and the involvement of electric consumers, members and leaders alike, all over the country, the NEA will be able to achieve meaningful and emphatic changes for rural progress and development that are inclusive and sustained in the generations to come." #

The CAGELCO II Board of Directors has resolved to designate Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba, ISD Manager as the Officer-in-Charge of the cooperative as GM Gabriel A. Tordesillas retires from his thirty-five (35) years of service

with CAGELCO II. The said designation was duly confirmed by Mr. Edgardo R. Masongsong, Administrator of the National Electrification Administration (NEA) last March 27, 2017.

Ms. Blandina Y. Madamba has joined the cooperative during its early years. A teacher by profession, she started her career as an Information Officer and climbed her way up as the Institutional Services Department (ISD) Manager in 1993 up to present.

Her passion in the rural electrification industry has earned her a position in national organizations such as the Philippine Association of Institutional Managers (PHILAIM), etc. With her unsurmountable commitment in this industry, she became well known with the other electric cooperatives and recognized her inputs with regard to institutional concerns especially with membership development.

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FINANCIAL REPORT

For the first three (3) months of year 2017, the Coop's Collection Efficiency showed a positive remark with a percentage of 105.05, surpassing the National Electrification Administration (NEA) Compliance Standard of 95%.

This attainment is due to the ontime payment of power bills of the member-consumers, thus, improving and stabilizing the Coop's financial viability. This also enables the Cooperative to pay its financial obligations to its power suppliers, transmission services and other charges promptly.

Having achieved this, it empowers the Cooperative—its Management Staff and employees to provide more reliable electric service to its memberconsumers. Further, it gives the Coop available funds to purchase equipment needed for the betterment of CAGELCO

II operations.

This was the first time in the history of CAGELCO II to attain such milestone of acquiring more than a hundred percent in its Collection Efficiency for the first quarter.

standing in its Average System Loss as it decreased to 10.85% for the month of March.

Coop activities such as Right-of-Way (ROW) Clearing, re-conductoring of deteriorated lines and service drop upgrading are being conducted to lower system loss.

Moreover, member-consumer-

owners (MCOs) can also contribute to decrease system loss thru reporting of electricity pilferage in their area and informing CAGELCO II Office if there are lines and poles that have been covered by trees or vines.

The Cooperative continuously strives to lower its system loss and exerts effort to be a Single Digit Electric Cooperative in the country.

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
